How long does a power bank take to charge?

The power bank charges to full in four hours via USB-C cable. It is certified FAA carry-on compliant and its compact size makes it an ideal travel companion. It has a hard plastic exterior with rounded edges and corners, meaning it's durable and easy to slide into a backpack.
